## The aims of the Platinum Jubilee 'Let's Create' project

Building Self-Belief CIO supported Tow Law Millennium Primary School, County Durham, and the wider Community in a range of creative and cultural activities to mark the Queen's Platinum Jubilee in June 2022.

The following anthology was created by the children of Tow Law Millennium Primary School across the 2022 summer term. The children developed their creative writing, art, graphic design, drama, communication and historical research skills in bringing this anthology together.

They researched the reign of Queen Elizabeth II across 70 years, leading to the Platinum Jubilee celebrations in June 2022.

The project enabled young and old to come together in common celebration of Queen Elizabeth's 70-year reign. All of the children's creative work was displayed and performed by them at the Tow Law Community Centre during the weekend of the Platinum Jubilee celebrations.

The project was delivered by Building self-Belief CIO, alongside a range of community partners and was funded by the County Durham Community Foundation and Arts Council England (ACE) through 'Let's Create' National Lottery support.

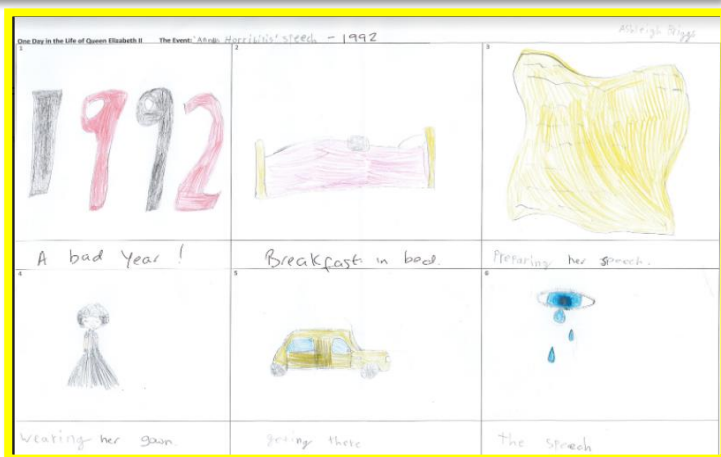
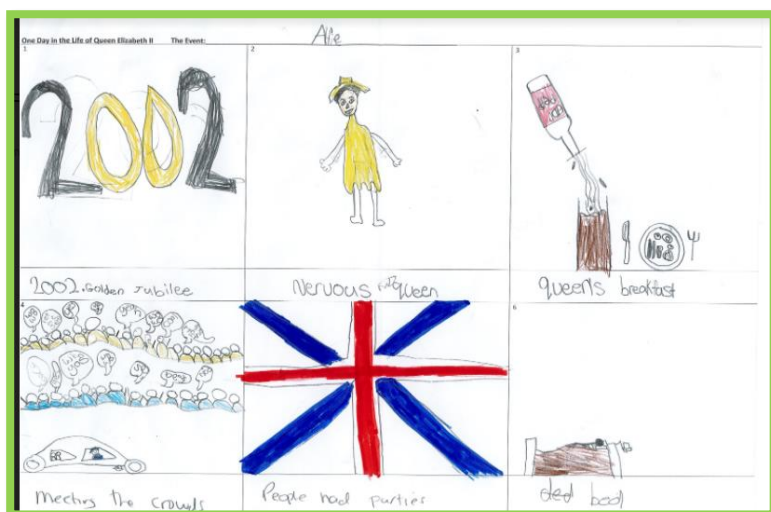

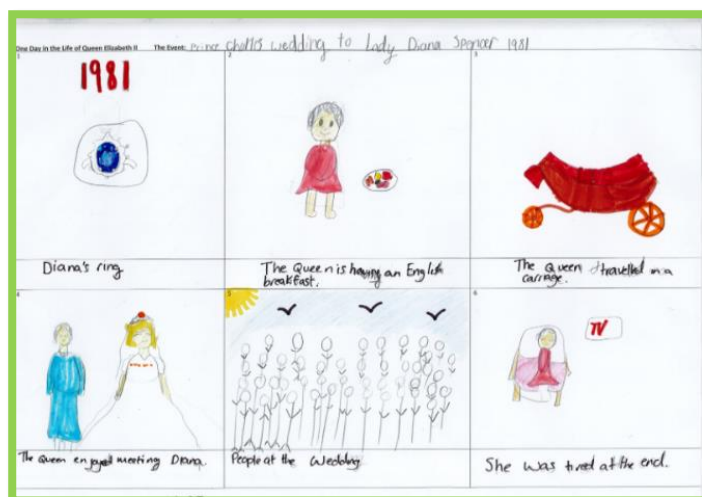
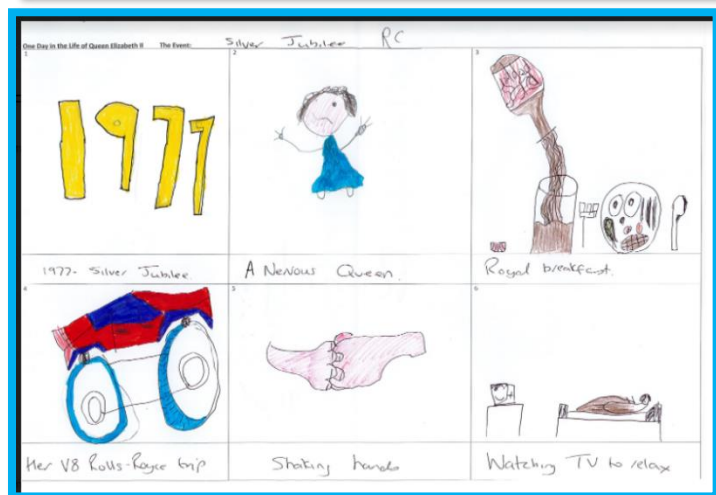
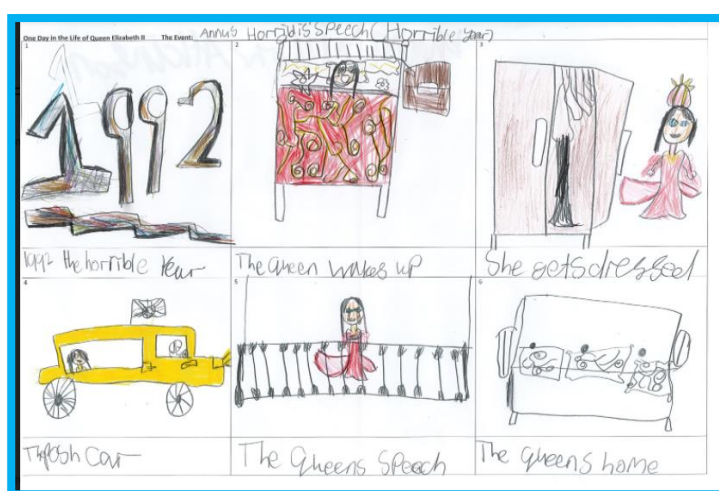
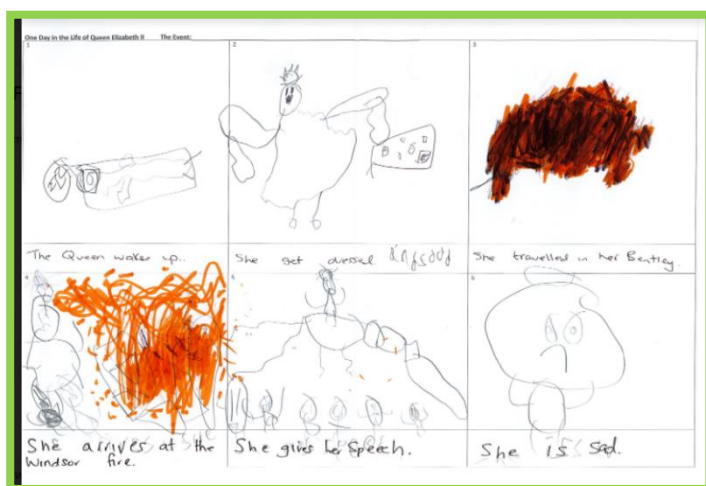
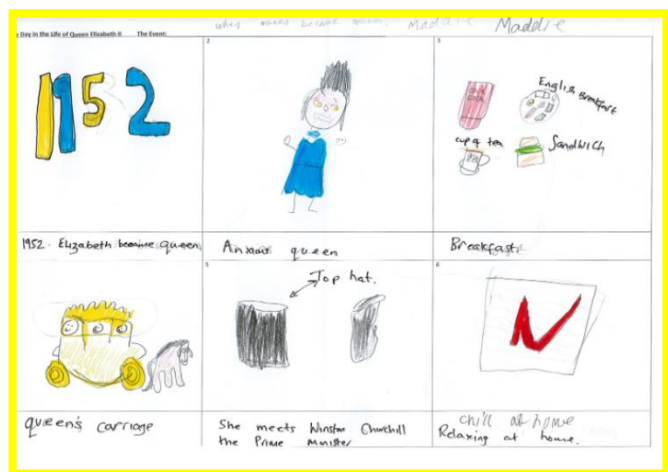


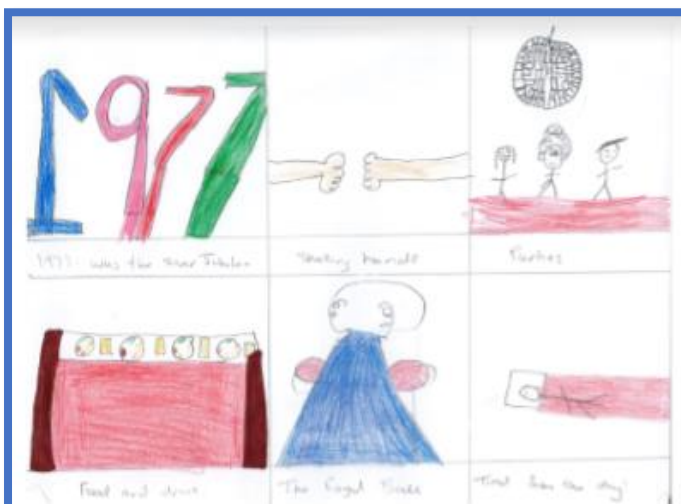
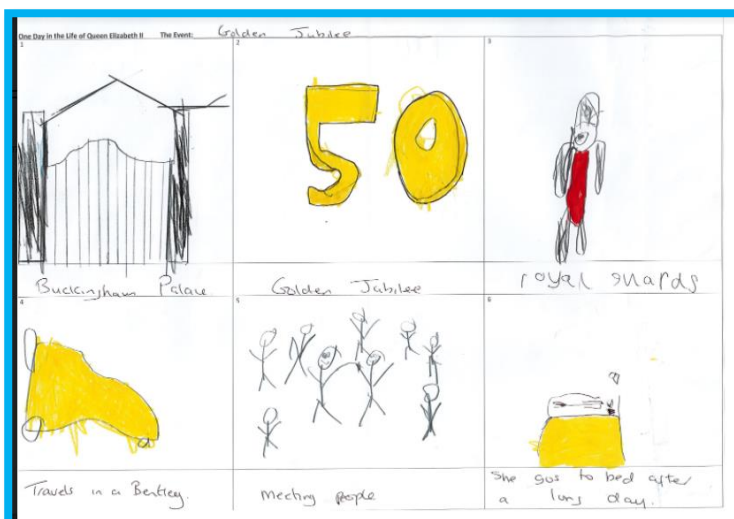
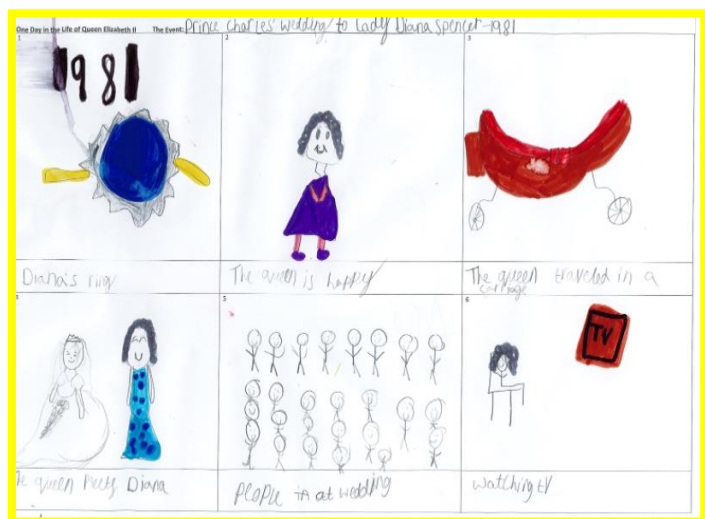
## The Platinum Jubilee Timeline

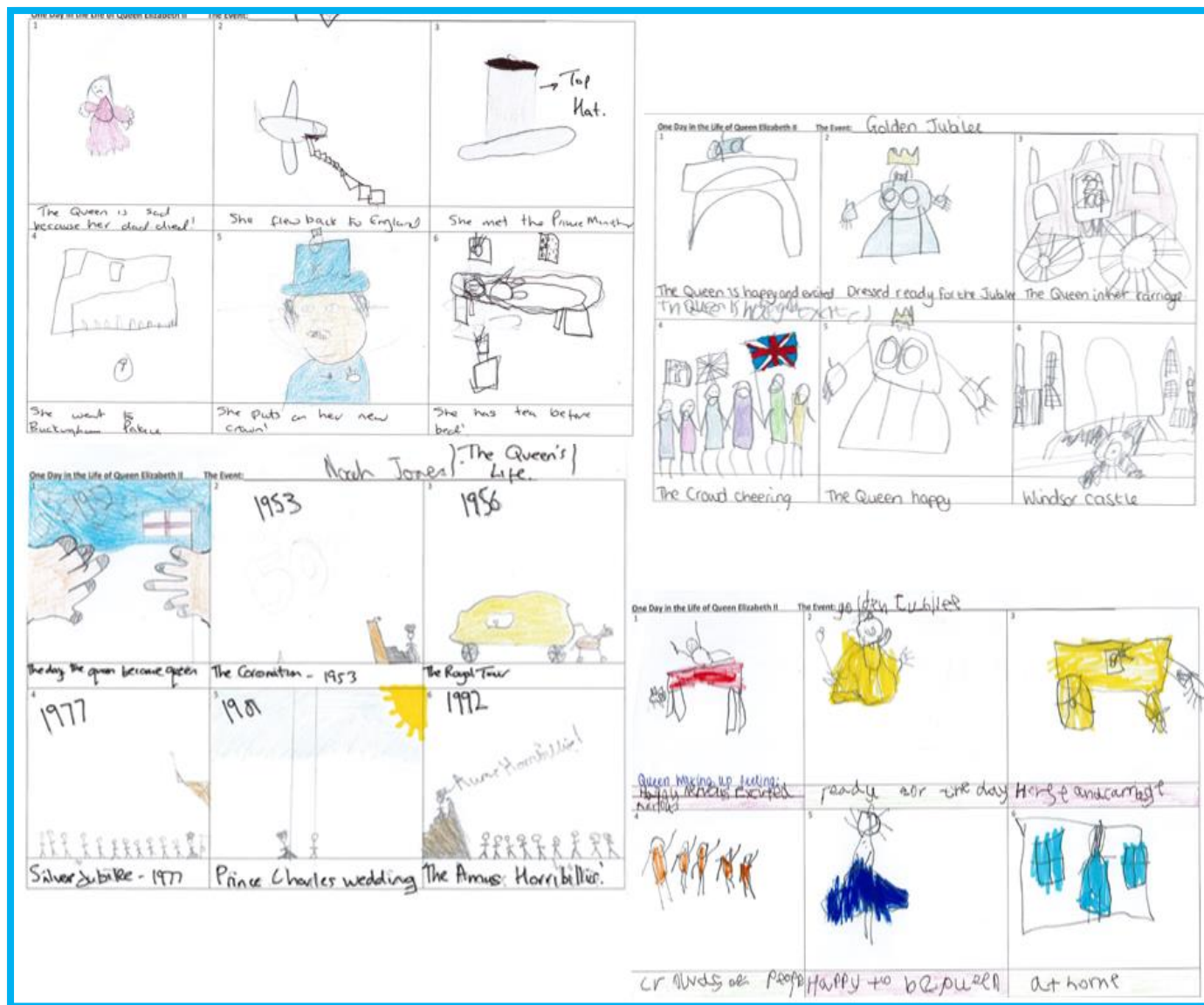

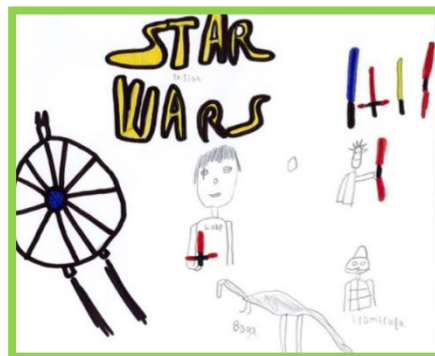
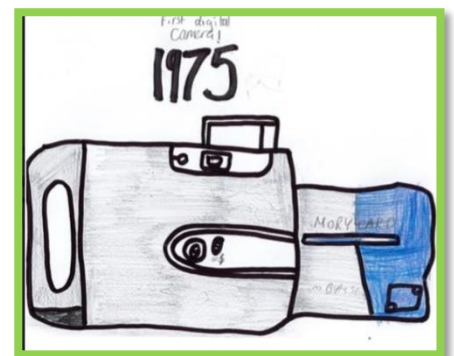
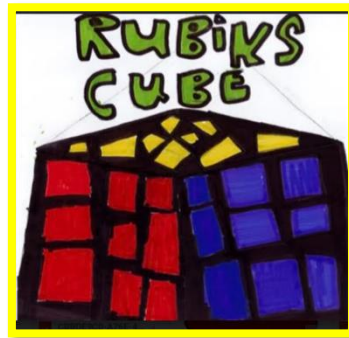
The children researched the famous inventions and that have changed the way that the British people lived since the start of Queen Elizabeth II's reign in 1952.



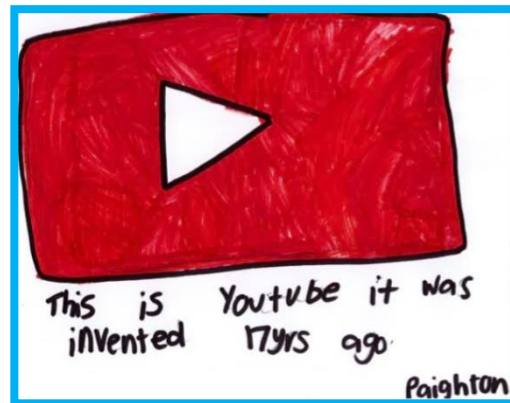
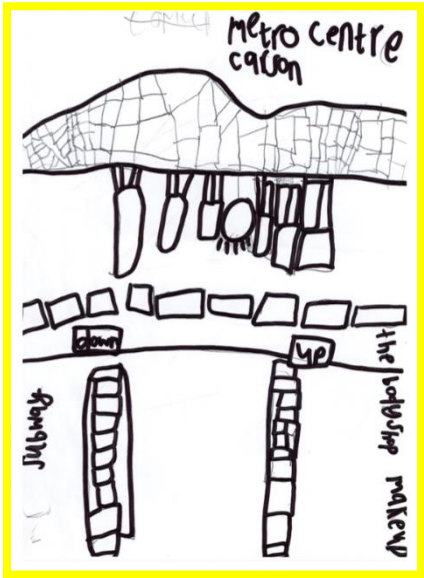
















## Creative Writing

The inspiration for the images used came from what the children considered 'being British', such as our love of pets and animals, going to the seaside, and of course a nice cup of tea!

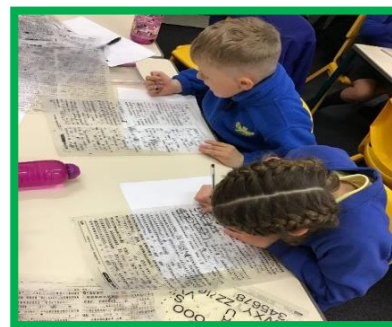

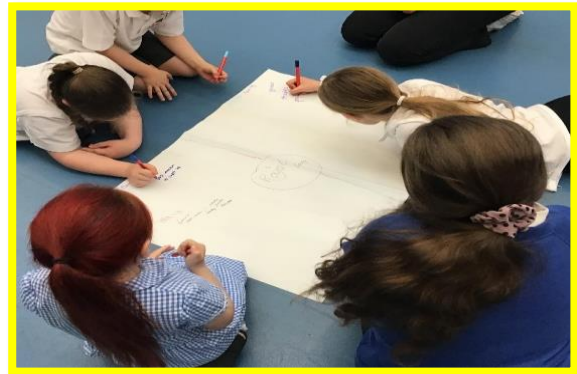

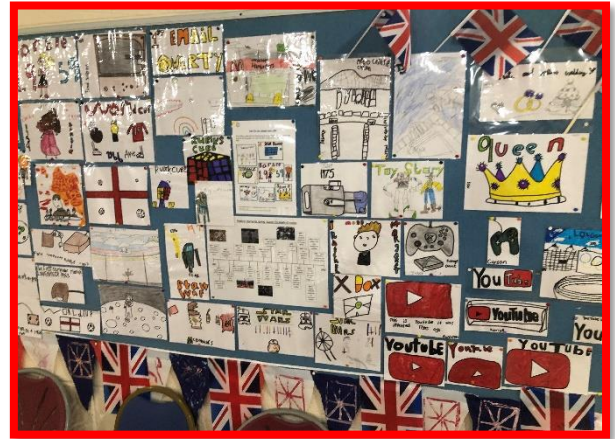


## The Platinum Jubilee Community Event
